Galileo Celebration

More details are being firmed up for the Galileo
Weekend of June 18, 19, & 20 (various times)
as ICI joins with the Rauch Planetarium, Frazier
History Museum and Bellarmine University in a
three-day salute to Galileo. Dr Rocky Kolb,
founding head of the NASA/ Fermilab
Theoretical Astrophysics Group and a Professor
at the University of Chicago will give the keynote
speech on Galileo as Astronomer, in a
fascinating (Friday) opening event which will
include: reception, lecture, a virtual whiz round
the universe at the Rauch, and, weather
permitting, a live star-gaze to complete a full
evening. Other notable national and regional
experts will lecture on Galileo the Inventor and
Galileo – His Place in History. There will be
events for the whole family. The activities will be
free with possible small fees for optional
activities, including a telescope workshop for
children and an opportunity to view the IMAX
